Notice to Candidates

Please make sure you follow these procedures in order to make the exams go as smoothly as possible for yourself and everyone else.

- Look at your timetable each morning to make sure which exams you have to attend.
- Each day, your Form Tutor will have a list of candidates for each exam which will tell you the time it begins, the room you are in and your desk number - make sure you get this information.
- Get to your exams promptly.
- Come to each exam properly equipped - for all exams, you will need to have a **black biro** (plus a spare), a HB pencil, a ruler and eraser; for some exams you will need more equipment such as a **calculator**, protractor, compass and colouring pencils. You are not allowed to use gel pens, correcting fluid or correcting tape.
- All equipment must be carried in a clear pencil case or clear plastic bag.
- Do not take any bags, books or papers to your desk, even in your pockets.
- You must not take mobile phones, ipods, MP3 Players or any other electronic equipment, including any associated wires/ear-pieces, into the exams.
- Do not talk or try to communicate with other candidates once inside the examination room - you will run the risk of being sent out and having your papers cancelled - your parents will be informed.
- You will not be allowed to leave the exam room until the examination is finished, even if you finish early - so do lots of revision to make sure you have plenty to write about!
- If an exam finishes part way through a lesson, you will be told to go back to your normal lesson - do not loiter on your way or disappear - registers will be taken.
- At the beginning of each morning and afternoon, you must go to your Form Room to be registered (unless informed otherwise) before going to your exams, otherwise you will be marked as absent.
